Travelling

Split has an international airport, which gets pretty busy during summer, connecting directly to tens of destinations Europewide. There are a variety of ways for arriving from the airport to the city of Split (please check the airport website: https://bre.is/NAazYN4v).

For those coming from of via Italy, a ferry from Ancona could be an option: https://www.jadrolinija.hr/en.

For the Sunday trip, the ferry ride is about 2 hours. The departure and return times in the program are listed according to winter schedule – in the summer, we expect denser connections.

Staying

All nights will be in Split, so there is no need to book rooms in Mostar. Among the hotels at walking distance from the conference venue, we can single out the following ones: Kastel (https://www.kastelsplit.com/en/), Globo (https://hotelglobo.com/), Bellevue (http://hotelglobo.com/), Bellevue (http://www.hotelpresident.hr/split/). B&B Kastel offers a 15% discount if you mention you are with Euroclassica and if you book directly with the establishment, but it has a very limited number of rooms.

However, depending on the overall state of affairs, the demand for accommodation can be high; therefore, it is advisable to book early.

Tourism tax is HRK 15 (~ € 1.99) by day and by person.

Further practical information

The currency in Croatia is kuna ($\le 1 \approx HRK 7.53$), which means "a marten". Marten pelts were used as currency by old Croats. In B-H it is convertible mark ($\le 1 \approx BAM 1.96$), which comes from Deutschmarks.

In the summer, because of tourist season, kuna is usually slightly more expensive.

As a rule, it is a better idea to buy your kunas in the city than at the airport.

Pease note that B-H is not in the European Union. Although citizens of EU are supposed to be able to enter the country with ID card, it is good to check again before arrival. Cheap roaming with EU is not available: sticking to WiFi is advisable.
